Notes about mapping curriculum...

This Curriculum Map is simply a GUIDE. All schools, school districts are different and need to adjust the teaching of standards based on their various resources and grade level traditions. Not all standards are explicitly taught.

Priority standards as determined by a district, school, or PLC are explicitly taught.

Some standards are taught in conjunction with district curriculum and supplementary materials.

Some grade level standards do not need to be addressed with students who have already mastered them (Phonics/Word Recognition) for example.

Standards on this curriculum map are taught using mini-lessons in a release of responsibility model "I do, we do, you do".

All standards are given a 2-3 week period of instruction. Common Formative Assessments are given for each standard with results discussed as a PLC for intervention and extension.

Many school districts have adopted Language Arts curriculum they are required to use. This curriculum should cover all basic grade level skills but is often short, quick stories or excerpts of stories.

The use of novels, either whole class or in small groups, is a great way to reinforce standards at a much deeper level like character development, story elements of conflict and resolution, theme etc.

I also teach non-fiction text on a weekly basis. My school purchases Time for Kids or Scholastic News and one day a week is devoted to the reading and analyzing of non-fiction text and reinforcing text features. Non-fiction text provides for rigorous reading and allows for discussion of events that are affecting our world getting kids to think outside of themselves.

Based on a 38 week school year ALL standards should be taught by the 30th to 32nd week of school. This allows for review, follow up, additional intervention and test prep for standardized testing in the final weeks..

The first 2 weeks of the school year are for teaching new classroom rules and routines along with back to school activities to informally assess each student's abilities. In addition, district level diagnostics are administered.

By week 3, curriculum should begin.

Mid year diagnostics should be given around week 19 of school.

The last 4 weeks of the school year are reserved for end of the year district diagnostics, possibly state standardized testing, and end of the school year activities to reflect on the year.

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
